IVES ANNUAL MEETING

For the first time, the **IVES Annual Meeting** was held outside Europe, taking place in **California**, **USA**, from February 26 to March 1, 2024.

GENERAL ASSEMBLY AND MAIN ACTIVITIES OF THE EXECTIVE COMMITTEE

During the General Assembly at **California State University, Fresno**, members were able to vote on important propositions:

• Approval of the final 2023 budget.

• Establishment of a selection procedure, led by the Executive Committee, to **double the number of editors-in-chief for OENO One** (1 in viticulture, 1 in enology). The candidates will be elected by our members in February 2025. The work carried out by the **Executive Committee** has also led to the drafting of the **'Rules of ethical conduct for the journals of IVES'**. This document will also be presented at the 2025 General Assembly.

IVES SCIENCE MEETING AND VISITS

The **IVES science meeting** was held at the **Culinary Institute of America** at Copia, Napa. During this day, 7 researchers, including the winner of the first OENO One young scientist award¹, shared their research with over **150 attendees**.

The conferences covered various topics such as **vineyard management** using advanced sensing technologies, grapevine **drought** response for sustainability, **climate** classification of wine regions, **winemaking vessel** impacts, **SO**₂, **mousy off-flavor** in wines, and wine **labeling**.

Thank you to Luca Brillante, Silvina Dayer, German Puga, Pierre Moulis¹, Stéphane La Guerche, Silvia Motta, and Mariona Gil i Cortiella for their presentations.

Throughout the week, participants visited leading research facilities, including California Polytechnic State University, UC Davis, and major wineries such as E. & J. Gallo Livingston Winery, Opus One and Joseph Phelps Vineyards.

OENO One is an **online peer-reviewed research journal** in the field of vine, grape and wine sciences published by IVES, with **Open Access**. After scientific validation by the associated editors and qualified reviewers, scientific articles are published online and accessible for free.

EDITORS-IN-CHIEF AND EDITORIAL MANAGEMENT

Since February 2024, the IVES Executive Committee has launched a process to recruit **2 additional editors-in-chief**. The successful candidates will be introduced during the GA in February 2025.

SUBMISSIONS AND ARTICLES PUBLISHED

In 2024, **225 scientific articles were submitted** and **107 published**. Some of these articles were published in **special issues** in collaboration with international conferences (2ICGWS: 2 articles, Terroir 2024: 7 articles).

READINGS

Around **542,000 readings** of the articles were recorded on the OENO One website in 2024.

OENO ONE YOUNG SCIENTIST AWARD

In 2024 the award was granted to Marine Morel for the article: "The role of rootstock and its genetic background in plant mineral status: the relationship between petiole analyses and deficiency symptoms" published in OENO One in April 2024.

IVES Technical Reviews is the online **peer-reviewed technical journal** published by IVES. It aims to provide **professionals** with high-quality scientific content in their native language. It is the only **Open Access** technical journal available in **6 languages: English, French, German, Italian, Spanish and Portuguese.**

The translation of these articles is made possible thanks to the financial support of our **4 high visibility partners**: Sogrape, WineHunter Hub, Moët Hennessy and the Universidad de La Rioja as part of the Enorregión project.

ARTICLES AND TOPICS COVERED

In 2024, **29 technical articles were published** in **6 languages**. 3 articles were illustrated using a **graphical abstract** produced in-house and in collaboration with the authors (see 2 examples page 16). The graphical abstracts are available in 6 languages.

READINGS

In 2024, around **115,000 readings** of the articles were recorded on the IVES Technical Reviews website compared with around 107,000 in 2023.



COMMUNICATION


In 2024, the **website** has been redesigned to modernise its look and **improve the user experience** (see page 17).

We also strengthened our collaboration with other technical journals and our professional network by sending out a **monthly selection of articles** (launched in June 2024, 60 contacts so far). It aims to boost visibility and encourage the republication of our content or its distribution through communication managers' networks. This has led to a significant increase in the number of readers.





NEW WEBSITE



The new **homepage** features a cleaner, more streamlined design, with articles illustrated with attractive pictures. This highlights the **most recent articles** while also better **distinguishing themes** such as viticulture, oenology, and other topics. The structure and menus have been reorganised to improve navigation, allowing users to **move easily from one language to another**.

In addition, work is underway to automatically direct users to the language corresponding to their **browser settings**.

IVES CONFERENCE SERIES

IVES Conference Series is a vine and wine online **Open Access portal** sharing scientific knowledge, results, and data presented during high-level international **scientific conferences**.

NEW FEATURE

A tool to automatically generate DOI was implemented in 2024.

CONFERENCES COVERED

Currently, IVES Conference Series includes **14 partner conferences** with over **3,500 documents** (abstracts, articles, videos, and podcasts) available with Open Access. In 2024, content from OENO Macrowine 2023 (Bordeaux, France), Open GPB 2024 (Logroño, Spain), OIV 2024 (Dijon, France), Macrowine 2016 (Changins, Switzerland), and Macrowine 2010 (Torino, Italy) were published. NEWSLETTER

The **IVES newsletter** was sent out every month, gaining 320 subscribers in 2024, reaching a total of around **3,320 recipients**.

Amidst the increase in subscribers, the interest in this media remained strong, with an approximate **30 % open rate**, particularly high compared to the standards. The **click rate** increased from 37 % to **47** % between 2023 and 2024.


This indicates that the content provided is of interest to our readers.



SOCIAL MEDIA

In 2024, we made a strategic decision to close the X (Twitter) handles of our journals to focus our efforts on platforms that best serve our community and goals.

IVES experienced remarkable growth and engagement on **LinkedIn**. Our community grew from **6,300** to **8,120 followers**, reflecting the dynamism and diversity of the content shared throughout the year.



HIGHLIGHTS

In 2024, we produced a **4-minute video** to introduce OENO One through an engaging interview with the journal's editors-in-chief: **Cornelis van Leeuwen** and **Pierre-Louis Teissedre**. This video was viewed more than **100 times on YouTube** and generated remarkable engagement on **LinkedIn**: it was viewed more than **6,000 times** and received **150 'likes'**, making it our **most-liked post of the year 2024**!

Our readers also showed significant interest in specific posts. The three **most-clicked** posts of 2024 were:

- 1. Highlight of the IVES annual meeting: the science meeting
- 2. Articles selection Contamination by Brettanomyces bruxellensis
- 3. Articles selection budbreak

These results highlight the topics and formats that resonate most with our audience, helping us to refine our communication strategy for the future.

The IT department (DSI) at the **University of Bordeaux**, which is responsible for the platform that hosts our journals, has put in place a **long-awaited long-term archiving system** for the journals and their content.
